Stadium Purposes Rate

Members noted the Stadium Purposes Rate for Wellington should be amended so that the Residential Rate reads as \$1,160,757 and the Rural Rate as \$8,730. It was further noted that the consent figures had been included in the public notice.

The rate pays for the local community's contribution to river maintenance and flood protection improvements - the balance being funded on a region wide basis from the general rate.
