The Chairman welcomed 12 members of the Kapiti Coast community to the meeting.

Clive Cottle stated that problems were being encountered in the Te Horo and Otaki Beach areas with pigeons in grain storage sheds and river areas. There were also problems with stoats and weasels which were discouraging tuis to return to the bush.

Irene Mackle had concerns with the effect on neighbouring bores in relation to an adjacent dairy farmer's land use resource consent application. Officers advised that this would be followed up with relevant staff in the Wellington office for a response.

Carl Lutz complimented staff on the excellent job being achieved with the killing of possums in Otaki and enquired as to when the next 1080 aerial drop was expected to occur and the future strategy for possum control. Mr Lutz also commented on the prevalence and control of Banana Passionfruit in the Otaki area.
