HCPH 08 Submissions Overall

Mr Brennand commented as follows:

- The Hutt Porirua Road Link did not just include economic advantages and issues of environmental values but also the question of impact on the Pauatahanui Inlet
- Pedestrian and cycle facilities especially linking Petone and Wellington had been a strong feature
- State Highway 2 Petone to Ngauranga options were important as were
- Improving access west including a possible link road between Petone and Granada
- Improving access across the valley floor and
- Bus and rail improvements especially in the Western Hutt

Mr Brennand listed the critical issues as follows:

- Coherent integrated packages
- Affordability
- Traffic growth
- Access to the Wellington CBD
- Freight movements across the Hutt Valley including Petone Esplanade
- Inter-district passenger transport accessibility
- Land use and demographic issues
- Packaging local and national roading projects

Councillor Evans thanked Mr Brennand for his comments and said on Friday, 9 May 2003 members will finalise their report to the Regional Land Transport Committee.
