Expected changes to the District Plan will include:

■ Updating maps to show the river corridors (both primary and secondary) and the erosion setback hazard line.

Accessory buildings of less then 20 square metres floor area erected in the Hutt River corridor becoming a permitted activity. All other buildings and structures would remain discretionary.

■ Standards for earthworks amended to strengthen and clarify existing provisions.
