Update on New Zealand ShakeOut

1. Purpose

To provide the Joint Committee with an update on New Zealand ShakeOut that took place on 26 September 2012.

2. Update on National activities

New Zealand ShakeOut, a web-based earthquake drill, took place on 26 September 2012 at 09:26.

Planning for the exercise started in November 2011. After a very successful community campaign 1,340,180 people had registered to take part in the Drop, Cover and Hold earthquake drill. This exceeded the initial target of one million participants.

NZ ShakeOut has been recognised as a success by the Ministry of Civil Defence Emergency Management (MCDEM) and a debrief of the National Planning Team was on 25 October 2012 with WREMO's ShakeOut project leader attending.

3. Update on WREMO activities

The final month of New Zealand ShakeOut saw the planning team dedicate more time and energy to the exercise and the implementation of a number of strategies. Schools were a specific target which saw 94% of schools in the region participating.

The roll out of the Mayoral billboard posters across the region supported an increase in media coverage and Facebook provided an excellent media to promote and share ShakeOut stories and activities.

It is a pleasure to report that the Wellington Region Emergency Management Office (WREMO) recorded the most participants (per capita) in New Zealand. Wellington City recorded the highest Territorial Authority per capita and Hutt

City and Masterton were in the top 5 Territorial Authorities. These figures are a reflection of the hard work and commitment of WREMO staff to make NZ ShakeOut a success in our region plus the enthusiasm with which the community embraced the message and exercise.

Table 1 provides the overall standings nationally, whilst the regional figures are shown in **Attachment 1** to this report.


